
PALISSADE CONE TABLE

INTRODUCTION

Based on the desire to develop a series of tables to complement the Palissade outdoor furniture collection, French design duo Ronan and Erwan Bouroullec teamed up with HAY to create the Cone Palissade Table. Its solid base and ultra-thin steel tabletop share the same graphic design idiom as the rest of the series, enabling the table to be strong without being bulky and elegant without being fragile.

The series comprises various sizes with round and square tabletops; all featuring a stabilising concrete base. Specifically designed for outdoor use, the powder-coated steel has a protective outdoor primer for optimal durability and resilience. The collection is available in selected colours and is ideal for terraces, balconies, gardens, cafés and public spaces.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

CAUTION

With a little care you can prolong the life of your furniture. Follow the instructions for the materials of your specific product to make sure that it stays in the best shape for as long as possible.

The information below is only intended as a general guideline. For more information on how to remove specific stains, please enquire where you bought the furniture.

- The Cone Palissade Table has a two component coat primer and outdoor powder coating which provides a barrier to corrosive elements making it suitable for outdoor use.
- Always remove stains quickly before they can do any permanent damage to the furniture.
- When you move your furniture, make sure you lift it rather than pulling or pushing it to avoid damaging the floor, legs and mountings.
- Tighten up the screws after one to two months' use and whenever required.
- Avoid improper use such as putting your feet on the table or standing on the it.

- Use coasters under damp, hot or coloured objects to avoid permanent stains.
- Be careful not to scratch or damage the surface with sharp objects.
- Avoid partially covering the surface, for example with tablecloths, cushions or place mats, as colour variances may appear.
- Minor spots of rust under the furniture and bases are considered as a natural result of general use and can be treated using the care instructions below.
- Direct placement on a seafront can lead to corrosion.
- Wipe off bird droppings quickly as they may lead to permanent corrosion or staining
- Wipe off the furniture if it becomes wet after rain or snowfall as this will damage the surface over time



POWDER COATED STEEL


- Wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water or in a solution of water and a neutral detergent. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth.
- Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface.
- Do not use solvents as they may have an adverse effect on the coating.
- · Never use acetic acid or citric acid.
- In the event of lime deposits on the surface use a clean, damp cloth wrung in lukewarm water with one part vinegar to nine parts water and avoid scrubbing as this may scratch the surface.
- Small scratches or damage to the powder coated surfaces can lead to corrosion. They can be retouched and protected from corrosion with a special repair lacquer available at HAY stores and authorized dealers. If the metal is uncovered it is necessary to sand the area before repairing it (grain 220). Wipe it over with a clean dry cloth and clean the area with methylated spirits before repainting it.

STORAGE


The life expectancy of your table will vary depending on the weather and type of use. We recommend that you store it in a dry, ventilated place during winter and keep it protected from scratches and bumps. Make sure that all parts are included.








While assembling, keep the table inside the cardboard box in order to protect the table from scratches etc. Make sure that all parts are included.






Do not assemble alone, a minimum of two people is recommended.

Place the A part on top of the B part, inserting the C part in between them.



Fasten the screws (E) with the Allen key (D). Make sure all screws are inserted before tightening them completely.
